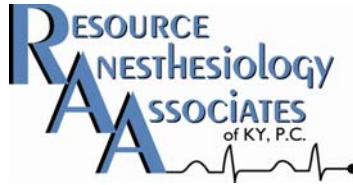

## **QUALITY MANAGEMENT AND PQRI** **DATA COLLECTION SHEET**

### **CANCELLATION**

- In preoperative holding area
- After induction of anesthesia has begun

### **MORTALITY**

- Within 48 hours of anesthetic care

### **AIRWAY**

- Failed tracheal intubation
- Dental trauma

### **RESPIRATORY**

- Re-intubation (within 24 hours of anesthetic care)
- Non-cardiogenic pulmonary edema (within 24 hours of anesthetic care)
- Aspiration pneumonitis while receiving anesthetic care

### **CARDIAC**

- Cardiac arrest (during procedure or within 24 hours of anesthetic care)
- MI (within 24 hours of anesthetic care)
- Development of significant arrhythmia

### **NEUROLOGIC**

- Peripheral nerve deficit (within 24 hours of anesthetic care)
- CVA (within 24 hours of care)

### **REGIONAL**

- Failed regional anesthesia
- Postdural puncture headache

### **MEDICATION**

- Medication error (wrong medication given)
- Medication dose error
- Adverse drug reaction

### **PACU**

- > 2 hours spent in PACU (unplanned)
  - If prolonged in PACU due to PONV check this box**
- Unplanned admission to higher level of care (i.e.-ICU)

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### **PQRI-Timing of Prophylactic Antibiotics**

Step 1 - Is your patient eligible for this measure?

- 1) The patient is 18 years or older?  YES  NO
- 2) Is there an order for a prophylactic antibiotic to be given within one hour prior to surgical incision (two hours if using Vancomycin or Fluoroquinolone)?  YES  NO

**STOP - IF YOU ANSWERED NO TO EITHER QUESTION ABOVE DO NOT PROCEED TO STEP 2**

Step 2 – Was the measure achieved?

- 1) Was the antibiotic given within one hour prior to surgical incision (Two hours if using Vancomycin or Fluoroquinolone)?  YES  NO
